for the first dress rehearsal, his only chance to see the full play, so we hope he was pleased, and we have kept up the high standard he always expects.




For the fifth time, we present a Derek Benfield play, having first performed one of his plays thirty years ago, but our first for several years. This play is a comedy rather than a farce, so watch out for the funny lines and characterisation, rather than an overly complicated plot with the distraction of running around, lost items of clothing and innuendo. We have an experienced cast, and hope that you'll be laughing as much as they have throughout the last few months of rehearsals.

Following the marathon effort of three short plays last September and our annual pantomime, we were aiming for something that would be simpler to stage. Sadly, this never happens as we like to get more and more adventurous with our sets – this time, we have tried setting the room at an angle, giving a different perspective, plus two new backdrops, one of which leads right into the wings. As always, we can't do this without a dedicated team of builders and artists, so thank you to everyone who has been involved in making the play look and feel true to its intended setting.

We hope that you enjoy the show and look forward to seeing you at our next production in the autumn.

THE WRITERAND THE PLAY

Born in 1926, **Derek Benfield** made dozens of big- and smallscreen appearances spanning six decades until shortly before his death in 2009, including recurring and one-off roles in many well-known series. In his career, he wrote over thirty comedy plays and is one of our group's 'go-to' writers when we are looking for a good laugh. Our group has previously performed *Post Horn Gallop* (1994), *Running Riot* (2002), *Over My Dead Body* (2010) and *Panic Stations* (2012).



Fish Out Of Water was first performed at the New Theatre, Bromley, in April 1962. For those who can't picture where this theatre was – it was located at the end of the High Street (where Barclay's now stands) but was destroyed by a fire in 1971; the theatre was where David Jason broke into the acting world, performing in a pantomime and a Noel Coward play in 1965.

'Fish Out Of Water takes place in a sun-drenched hotel somewhere on the Italian Riviera: the sort of romantic, sweet-smelling spot we all long to escape to for a little piece and quiet after the bustle of London. Into this idyllic setting strides Agatha Hepworth, a loud, outspoken, jovial cockney widow, and her timid spinster sister, Fiona Francis. Agatha, rosy and beaming, crushes all protests as she rounds up the hotel guests into communal games and joint enterprises of every kind. They came on holiday, she maintains, to enjoy themselves – and she is going to see that they do! With untiring energy, she invades the private lives of all the characters with surprising and riotous results'.

MARK JAMPESON as Brigadier Hubback Mark made his debut on our stage thirty years ago in *Laugh! I Nearly Went To Miami*; while he was involved in many early productions and has always supported us, he has only been able to appear on our stage occasionally in recent years. Recent appearances include an Ugly Sister in 2022 and the central role in *Cash On Delivery*; he is best remembered for performing both Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde at the same time.

VAL COATES as Mrs Hubback

Val first appeared on our stage in *Murder In Play* (2008), playing various senior ladies, from the intelligent *Agatha Crusty* and Lady Agatha in *Hound Of The Baskervilles*, to doddery drunk Miss Bourne in *The Ghost Train*, to the stern DSS supervisor in *Cash On Delivery* and, most recently, a confused a children's writer in *Move Over Mrs Markham*; she has also played wicked panto stepmothers and the Dame on two occasions.





LINDSEY, CLAYTON as Dora Cowley

Lindsey has made regular appearances since 2016 and is always ready to step into a role at short notice or lend a hand backstage to keep the show on track. She has appeared in almost every post-lockdown production, with recent roles including the Deputy Sheriff in *Who Shot The Sheriff?* And the bathing beauty in *Afternoon At The Seaside* – actually an undercover police officer who wasn't covered by very much.

RAE CALMAN as Marisa

Rae first appeared in *Play On!* (1995) and is our group's Chair, make-up and social media expert. Most recently, she has been seen as the saloon owner and murderer's accomplice in *Who Shot The Sheriff?* and the evil Fairy Pernicia in *Puss In Boots*; she was then framed for murder in *The Rats* (where she was on stage for the entire play) and as So-Shy in our latest pantomime.





HAZEL BERGMAN as Agatha Hepworth First appearing in the chorus of King Arthur (2003), Hazel has played a range of characters, having the most fun when playing dominant, powerful characters, so her current role is perfect for her (although this time she doesn't get to throw soup over anyone's head, or put trifle down anyone's trousers). Most recently, she appeared as a marriage guidance counsellor in Cash On Delivery and as the Genie Of The Ring in our last pantomime.

CHRISTIME BELSHAM as Fiona Francis

First appearing in our second production of *Jack And The Beanstalk* (2009) Christine has played many smaller roles: sometimes in a quieter background part, but also as feisty, bossy strong women. Her biggest role to date was as the Vicar in *Murder At The New Vicarage*; she is excellently cast alongside Hazel once again – as her gentle Genie counterpart a few months ago and now as her shy sister.





STEVE MORLEY as J.C. Mallett

First appearing in *The Roses Of Eyam* (1996), Steve has appeared in over forty roles, most recently as the Sheriff in *Who Shot The Sheriff*, and every-one still talks about the dwarf / traffic warden that has appeared in three separate pantos. Steve enjoys stage managing and directing, trying new effects and ideas, as shown in designing three very different sets to fit onto our stage when he directed last year's trio of Agatha Christie short plays.

HARRY OWEN as Len Barrett

Now appearing in his tenth production, Harry is the newest member of the group appearing this time. He first appeared in *Rapunzel* (2017) and has appeared in every pantomime since, from comedy double acts, to a giant, to a bossy Queen, and most recently as a dwarf / ballerina. Last year, Harry played a camp interior designer in *Move Over Mrs Markham*, but this time he's after the ladies...





PAUL BERGMAN as Julian Whittle

Paul joined us for the first time as one of the 'Sunshiners' chorus in our first musical production, *The End Of The Pier Show* (2004). He enjoys comical roles but can equally play deadpan characters and bring the tension to serious roles. Most recently, he has performed in *Cash On Delivery* and *The Rats*, and appeared as the Dame for the third time in our last pantomime.

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TEN TIMES TABLE

A Comedy by Alan Ayckbourn, Directed by Stephen Brody

The leading lights of the village have decided to hold a pageant of local history based on a somewhat vague event, "The Massacre of the Pendon Twelve". But there's a young left-wing teacher on the committee who decides to turn it into a rally for proletarian revolution. Committee meetings become symbolic battlefields for conflicting views - the right-wing faction being led by the Chairman's conservative wife. The event turns into a violent confrontation between the two extremes, with cataclysmic results. Police intervention brings matters to a relatively quiet conclusion, but already another pageant - Romans versus Britons - seems an attractive possibility.
