WELCOME TO THE SHOW!

Welcome to our 34th pantomime! We would like to welcome back Sabrina as our Director, who directed *Puss In Boots* for us two years ago: on that occasion, her enthusiasm and theatrical experience invigorated the cast and kept them working hard, and this year's production is no exception, with some very funny scenes and routines to keep our audience engaged.

This is our fourth production of *Sleeping Beauty* – it was our first ever pantomime, back in 1991 when the group was still a bit of an experiment. Since then, we revisited the story in 2004 and 2015. Several of our members have been involved somehow since the second production, but Daryl is the only current member of our group that appeared in that first one – as Wonderwoman! Although you won't see Daryl this time, we hope that you won't hear her either – she is our Prompt. Also worthy of note, Mark put on a Dame's dress for the first time in our second version and is reprising the role this time. We also welcome some new players: we welcome James R and Emily to our team as our King and Kitty (both of whom have worked with Sabrina before), while Wayne appears in his first panto, and Sienna and Leah have been 'promoted' to the main chorus. Sadly, Peter, our long-standing pianist, cannot join us this time, but we are pleased that Ciara is swapping the stage for a keyboard and saxophone to accompany some of the songs.



We hope that you will enjoy our show and look forward to welcoming you again later this year. Also, look out for something special next January: our 2026 panto will be the group's 100th production – we plan to present *Snow White*, based on one of our earliest scripts, mixing classic jokes with our much more advanced staging and talent – not to be missed!

THE WRITERAND THE PLAY

Like many of our favourite fairytales and pantomimes, 'The Sleeping Beauty In The Wood' has been retold many times, including by Italian poet Giambattista Basile (as 'Sole, Luna e Talia', or 'Sun, Moon and Talia'), French civil servant Charles Perrault (under its original title 'La Belle au Bois Dormant') and the German Brothers Grimm (as 'Dornröschen', or 'Little Briar Rose'). The story is believed to have originated from the mid 12th century as part of the French narrative 'Perceforest'.

Throughout the last century, many adaptations for stage and screen have been created, including (of course!) a Disney movie in 1959, based on the Perrault and Grimm versions (strangely, the *Sleeping Beauty Castle* centrepiece at Disneyland opened four years before the film was released). Pantomime versions have been performed for over 200 years, the first being at Drury Lane in 1806.

This is our group's fourth pantomime written by **Ben Crocker**, all of which have been performed by us in the last six years. Ben has grown up enjoying pantomimes – his father John was also an actor and pantomime writer. He has over thirty years of theatre experience, directing many productions and has served as Artistic Director at a theatre in Exeter. In addition to his amateur stage scripts, Ben also adapted one of his 'Cinderella' scripts for Comic Relief's star-studded lockdown pantomime in 2020.

HARRY OWEN as Billy the Royal Butler

Harry has appeared in ten of our previous productions, last appearing as a cockney holidaymaker in *Fish Out Of Water*. Two years ago, he played the Dame, and has also appeared as a pirate, a giant and in a couple of comedy duos – this time, he plays the friendly comic servant for the first time.

JAMES RILEY as King Norbert

We would like to welcome James to his first pantomime with the St Martin's Players, though he is no stranger to performing, having previously worked with Director Sabrina on a production of *The Little Mermaid*. We hope to welcome James to our cast for future productions.





MARK JAMIESON as Queen Dorothy

Mark has appeared on our stage (and others) regularly for over thirty years, most recently appearing as a retired Brigadier in *Fish Out Of Water*. In Pantoland, he has played the Dame on four previous occasions – he seems to like the magnificent costumes and make-up.

EMILY WILKING as Kitty

Emily is appearing with the St Martin's Players for the first time in this year's pantomime. She describes herself as "a gentle woman with the mind of an adult but the heart of a child", and Kitty is her first role of 'unique'" – we look forward to a purr-fect performance, even if the play ends up as a cat-astrophe!





DEBRAGAVIN as Fairy Peaceful

Debra, along with husband Barry, haven't made many panto appearances lately as they regularly team up to direct – we have them to thank for two of the last three pantomimes, always drawing a huge crowd. Debra last appeared briefly on stage in *The Rats*, and one of the sisters in *Puss In Boots* '23.

JULIE EXELL as Fairy Graceful

Julie works hard to ensure everyone looks spectacular on stage while learning her role. Last year, she played one of the Chinese policemen along with Marion (our props collator); this time, they are teaming up with Monica (our other wardrobe expert) to make our trio of supporting fairies.







MARION BIRAM as Fairy Beautiful

Marion has appeared regularly on our stage since 2008 in roles of all sizes, and also manages our properties for many productions. Last year, she played the other Chinese policeman; other recent roles include the bossy old lady in *Afternoon At The Seaside* and the suffering wife in *Cash On Delivery*.

MONICA CANE as Fairy Thoughtful

Another long-standing member, Monica usually focuses on helping Julie to organise costumes but still likes to appear in smaller roles or in the background of our productions. Most recently, she appeared as the nurse who surprisingly tried to commit a murder in *The Patient*, and a nun in *Who Shot The Sheriff?*






RAE CALNAN as Carabosse

Having played So-Shy in last year's production of *Aladdin*, Rae is returning to the role of the panto baddie. She is always heavily involved in each production, whether performing or assisting to ensure everything runs smoothly; she will be directing our first ever radio play later this year.

BARRY GAVIN as Spindleshanks

Barry is our set construction expert and a regular pantomime director; he has appeared most recently in two of our three Agatha Christie one-act plays and as one of the miller's sons in *Puss In Boots* '23. He previously appeared as a feline sidekick in *Puss In Boots* '98 – now he dons a furry costume once again





VICTORIA JAMIESON as Princess Aurora

Most recently appearing as the good fairy in *Puss In Boots '23* and a very quiet seamstress in *Ten Times Table*, Victoria has regularly appeared in our plays and pantomimes for over 20 years – once again playing the child while her father puts on a dress and plays the part of her mother.

JAMES BELSHAM as Prince Orlando

James has appeared in a wide range of leading roles over several years, from Buttons to Puss In Boots to Victor Frankenstein – this time, he plays the Principal Boy for the first time. Last year, he appeared as Wishee-Washee and a Marxist history teacher, delivering a scarily loud monologue with gusto.
